Born in 1963 and lives in Stockholm. Her 2007 book “Silent Seas (Tyst hav)” revealed the depletion of marine resources caused by excessive fishing. She won the “The Swedish Journalism Award” and “Environmental Journalist of the Year” in 2007. She was elected to the European Parliament on June, 2009. In November 2009 her book was translated into Japanese.
